



### **Step 1 – Preparation for Employment**

- 1. Complete a Vocational Profile.
- 2. Create a professional email address (app on phone if possible).
- 3. Create an up-to-date CV and write a covering letter.
- 4. Interviews virtual, face-to-face, panel, group.
- 5. What is volunteering, part time and full-time employment?
- 6. How to get to work walk, bus, train, car travel training.
- 7. What are the key employability skills and why are they important?
- 8. Career services Job Centre, National Careers Service, Kent Supported Employment.
- 9. Complete courses on Your Game Plan (CPD certified courses).
- 10. Take part in an internal work placement, community project or enterprise project at The Oaks.





#### Step 2 – Research, Explore & Experience

- 1. Explore different industries Retail, Hospitality, Horticulture etc.
- 2. Research and explore three jobs in your local area that you would like to experience.
- 3. Research local, national, and global employers.
- 4. Research different job roles The hierarchy of employment.
- 5. Travel training (planning, route, time, cost).
- Create an account on Indeed (upload CV).
- 7. Introduction to Reverse Jobs Fair (create a Jobs Board, develop an elevator pitch, attend Reverse Jobs Fair).
- 8. Interview Skills workshop at The Hive (personal presentation, communication and interaction, interview skills and understanding themselves).
- 9. Apply for one employment or volunteering opportunity per term (check emails daily/weekly).
- 10. Attend an external work placement, volunteering, or group community project (either local to where the learner lives or local to the college).





### Step 3 - Let's get working

- Attend an external work placement, volunteering, or community project opportunity (local to where the learner lives).
- Continued travel training support. Support from Job Coaches for individual placements.
- Apply for one employment or volunteering opportunity per week (check emails daily).
- 4. Interview skills workshops. Different types of interviews.
- Identify and attend CPD courses that support career options (First Aid, CSCS Card, food hygiene, driving theory, customer service etc.).
- Introduction to other career and recruitment services visit to job centre.
- 7. Apply for jobs, attend interviews, and secure employment or volunteering (local and accessible).
- 8. If employment is not achieved. Research and investigate "next step" opportunities. Further education or training courses, supported employment, apprenticeships, or traineeships.





### **Step 4 - Continued support**

- Attend "Next step" opportunity (Further Education or training courses, Supported Employment, apprenticeships, or traineeships).
- 2. Attend transition event Supported Employment services.
- 3. Sign up to universal credit and visit the Jobs Centre for employment support.
- 4. Contact your designated careers advisor and ask for support to find employment. (National Careers Service, Job Centre etc.)
- 5. Contact a local recruitment agency and see what opportunities they have available in your local area.
- 6. Continue to search and apply for volunteering and employment.
- 7. Stay in contact with your Careers Leader at The Oaks. Let us know if you gain employment, complete courses, or move onto further training courses.
